

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

Many students may not know at this point what area of study they wish to pursue while others may have a definite plan. Regardless of the situation, if a student is planning to attend a post-secondary institute next year, they should apply to several different schools to keep their options open. If students are thinking of applying to institutions outside Canada, they should talk to Ms. Quamme so that arrangements can be made for the application process.

You can apply to post-secondary schools online. Students can apply for most public **post-secondary institutions in BC** at <u>applybc.ca</u>. You will fill out an application form online some schools have the same application form. However for the following schools you can go to **Apply BC list** scroll down and select the right schools for you. For the external applications (BCIT, Royal Roads University and smaller private schools) you will apply to them separately but the links to these programs are on this same web page).

Out of province Post-secondary schools have similar organizations that allow you to apply to multiple schools through their web sites.

The early admission deadlines can be as early as Mid. November or early December for a September entry (admission deadlines vary depending on faculty and program in each post-secondary institution). For many of the schools in BC, students should be looking into how to apply as early as October. If a student is applying out of province they may need to apply earlier. It is necessary to check deadlines in October for each school to see what the deadline dates are. Some post-secondary programs have limited entry and should be applied for as early as possible.



You will notice in your research that each post-secondary institution requires something a little different than the others for their entrance requirements. **Therefore it is very important that you check the specifics of the post-secondary institutions and programs you think you may be enrolled in**. What will work at one school may not work at another. Many of the programs have mark requirements for math and English and Grade Point Average (GPA), so be sure to check those.

The most current information about post-secondary institutions will be found on the web. Academic Course Requirements

Many post-secondary institutions require that students take <u>at least 4-6 academic</u> <u>courses at grade 12 level</u> for admission and some post-secondary schools may require these courses from their specified course list. Only certain courses may qualify so please check each post-secondary institutes' list and make sure you check early to be sure you have the requirements necessary for your program of choice.

We always recommend that students take more courses than the minimally required in case one course does not go as well as planned. Please note if one of a students' grade 12 course is taken in second semester the institute may use a student's grade 11 mark to calculate their GPA (grade point average).

POST-SECONDARY REQUIREMENTS

Post-secondary institutions are constantly changing what is required for entrance to their schools. Please check the post-secondary institute for their average admission rates.

Many major universities now have a broader-based admission process. This means if your marks are just below the average required to be admitted to certain faculties, and you have been involved in many other activities in your high school years, (i.e.) community service, leadership, athletics, you may be admitted on the basis of those other activities. The marks required to be admitted to these schools continue to rise each year.

Online and Distributed courses completion date requirements

Online and distributed learning may have different completion dates required so you should check this if you are taking an online course that you need as a prerequisite for a program of choice.

Sending Out Your Transcripts

Once you have decided on and applied to your program(s) and post-secondary institution(s) you will need to send out your transcripts through the government service called STUDENT TRANSCRIPTS SERVICE http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca

The Ministry of Education assists each graduating student planning to pursue postsecondary education by sending a copy of his or her transcript data.

The BC Ministry has online transcript service for students. The Ministry of Education runs the Student Transcripts Service, a web-based service that makes secure transcript sharing between students and participating post-secondary institutions quicker and more convenient. Students will also be able to access other information through this service, such as exam results and scholarship status.

Sending Out Your Transcripts



Step 1 Go to the Ministry of Education's Transcripts and Certificate website at http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca.

Step 2 Students must register for a BC Government account, a **BCeID**. Follow the system prompts and register for STS. Finally log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using the BCeID.

From a student's STS Dashboard make post-secondary institution selections, view transcript, view assessment results, and send transcripts immediately.

Applying to BC public universities and colleges also just got easier! Students can do it all: search, plan and apply on **EducationPlannerBC.ca**.

We will have a meeting with the grade 12's early November to make sure they know the procedure for ensuring their transcripts are sent out to the institutions of their choice.

Note: When ordering your transcripts go to BCeID click on Current Student and register for Basic BCeID

CHECK APPLICATIONS STATUS

ONCE THE APPLICATIONS ARE SENT OUT CHECK OUT YOUR STATUS (EG. ACCEPTED OR TRANSCRIPTS NOT YET RECEIVED) BY GOING INTO EACH ACCOUNT THAT THE INSTITUTE PROVIDES FOR YOU AND LOOKING AT YOUR STATUS.

Students should be sure to **Check the Status** of their applications online to the post-secondary schools they have applied to, to make sure that each school has all the information it needs to determine whether you will be accepted. Be sure to check if they require transcripts from our school and if there is a problem contact Heather Quamme (hquamme@sd48.bc.ca).

HOUSING AT POST-SECONDARY SCHOOLS

You will need to apply separately for student housing at your institute of choice.

Post-secondary housing sometimes is referred to as student housing and is usually in very high demand and everyone who would like to be in student housing should be sure to get their application in on time. The deadline may be different for each institution so again, you should check with each school. For example, University of Victoria students entering university directly from high school will be guaranteed accommodation provided they have applied before their deadline and if they met the required criteria.

Often schools will guarantee housing space for all students living outside of their campus and beyond a reasonable distance to commute. Check your institutions to ensure you are aware of the deadlines for applying to student housing.

OTHER INFORMATION

SAT INFORMATION

If you are planning to go to school in the United States you may need to write the SAT exam. The SAT tests a student's knowledge of English and Math. The deadlines for registration can be about two months before the exam is written, so you need to think ahead, to be sure you are registered on time. Provincial Awards and Entrance Scholarships

Provincial Scholarships

If you plan to continue your education beyond Grade 12, you can learn how to access money through scholarships available from the Ministry of Education. Scholarship winners receive vouchers to help with tuition costs at **designated post-secondary institutions** and **authorized trades training providers**

District/Authority Scholarships

These \$1250 scholarships are awarded to graduating students with outstanding achievement in one of several areas of interest. The areas include:

- Indigenous Languages and Culture, demonstrated at school or in the community
- Fine Arts (e.g., Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
- Applied Skills (e.g., Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics)
- Physical Activity (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical
- Education)
- International Languages
- Community Service (Volunteer Activity), which includes demonstration of
- local and global issues and cultural awareness
- Technical and Trades Training (e.g., Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics,
- Cook Training)

Students should apply for these scholarships in the year they graduate directly to their local scholarship committee.

BC Excellence Scholarships

These \$5000 scholarships are awarded to **55** well-rounded graduates who demonstrate community service, leadership, and commitment to their chosen career paths. Each secondary school in BC may put forward a nominee who must submit an application package to the Ministry through their school district office.

BC Achievement Scholarships

Graduating students with high achievement in a broad range of courses might qualify to win scholarships worth \$1250. These scholarships are based on academic achievement in required and elective courses that meet graduation requirements. No application is required and students are contacted in the fall after their graduation.

Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarships

These \$5000 scholarships recognize 20 exceptional Grade 12 students who plan to become teachers in the K-12 education system. Winners will receive a scholarship voucher to redeem upon entrance to an approved BC Faculty of Education teacher-training program. Students apply to the Ministry of Education for this scholarship. The deadline for this application is February 15.

French Program Awards

Secondary School Apprenticeship Awards

Youth In Trades students are eligible for this award. This programs has additional information about criteria and procedures related to this award. Once Youth In Trades program is completed with 900 hour documented with the Industry Trade Authority \$1000 Award Criteria is available.

International Education Scholarships and awards

The Ministry of Education provides international education scholarships and awards to:

- Promote the development of intercultural knowledge and skills for B.C. students and teachers
- Develop and strengthen relationships with foreign partners
- Promote the recruitment of French language and French immersion teachers to B.C.

Pemberton Secondary Local Scholarships and Bursaries

All grade 12 students will receive The Pemberton Secondary Scholarship Book in Feb. outlining the available **local** scholarships with the criteria for each application. Grade 12 students will have the opportunity to apply for these local awards. Applications will be due in April. These awards are presented at the Farewell Ceremony in June. Students are required to write a **letter of application** and identify the scholarships they wish to apply for. Although some of these awards are for academic excellence, there are others that reward citizenship, athletics, and community involvement.

Post-Secondary Sources

If a student has high marks they should try to apply to their post-secondary schools as early as possible since there are usually scholarships available to those students. The earlier you apply the earlier you can find out what you need to do to get the money. You should apply in November as some deadlines are in December.

Most post secondary schools will make sure that if a student has qualified to be accepted at the school that the school will work with the student to make sure lack of money does not prevent the student from attending.

BC Awards and Funding Online

There are many scholarships and awards available from government, post-secondary institutions, private industry, and non-profit organisations. Student Aid BC is also a government web site that provides some award programs.
